The Arrowstreet-designed Artists for Humanity EpiCenter is featured in the Green Building Cell Phone Tour, a new program through The Museum of Science, Boston. EpiCenter visitors can use their cell phones to access a personal guided tour, which describes sustainable building features and offers practical advice for increasing green awareness in everyday life.

The tour features commentary from James Batchelor, FAIA, LEED AP, President and CEO of Arrowstreet. Mr. Batchelor is the Chair of BuildingEnergy07 Conference, the annual conference of the Northeast Sustainable Energy Association (NESEA).

In 2004, the Artists for Humanity EpiCenter became the first building in the city of Boston to attain a Platinum LEED rating, the highest awarded by the US Green Building Council.

Arrowstreet is a multidisciplinary design firm based in Somerville, MA. Since 1961, the firm's designs have been based on a unique approach: look beyond traditional architectural and planning concerns into the underlying political, economic, and social issues which affect the success of a project. The firm, with 17 LEED accredited professionals, has been an active member of the U.S. Green Building Council (USGBC) since 1998.

Artists for Humanity is a non-profit educational group founded in 1991 by Susan Rodger-son with the mission of bridging economic, racial and social divisions by providing at-risk youth with the keys to self-sufficiency through paid employment in arts.
