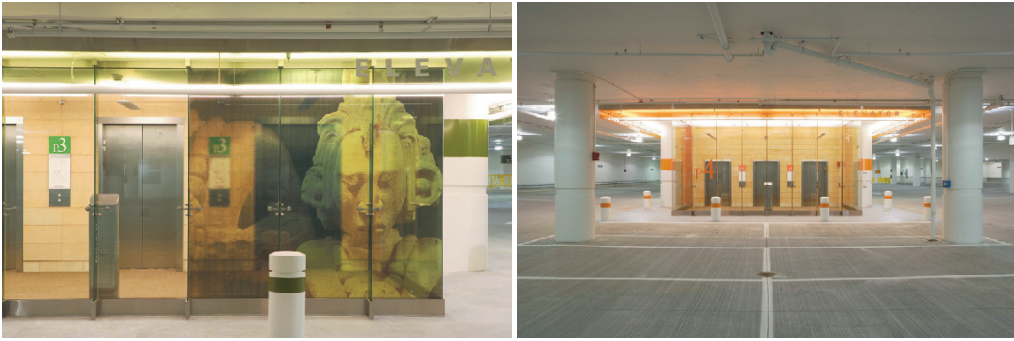

TWO HONORS FOR HARVARD UNIVERSITY'S NORTH CAMPUS PARKING GARAGE

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Arrowstreet is pleased to announce that the firm is the recipient of two design awards for the North Campus Parking Garage at Harvard University:

- Boston Society of Architects Interior Architecture/Interior Design Award
- Society for Environmental Graphic Design 2006 Design Awards Program Merit Award

Harvard commissioned Arrowstreet to design the parking garage in 2001, as part of the master plan for future building uses on their North Campus. The 731-car, underground garage was built using a “top down” construction system, reducing the impact of dust and noise from the excavation on the immediate neighborhood.

Arrowstreet approached the project as both an interior and graphic design commission, so users would be able to orient themselves from any point in the large space. Each of the four glass-walled elevator lobbies is colored distinctively and themed with imagery from one of Harvard’s museums.

Arrowstreet is a multidisciplinary design firm based in Somerville, MA. Since 1961, the firm’s designs have been based on a unique approach: look beyond traditional architectural and planning concerns into the underlying political, economic, and social issues which affect the success of a project.

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
